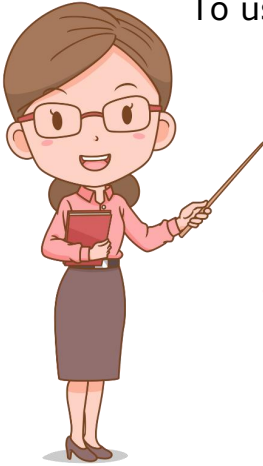


### 2.3 Introduction to Present Perfect Tense

To use **present perfect tense**, we use **have/has + the past participle**.



<b>I</b>	<b>have</b>	<b>eaten</b>	Chinese food in China.
<b>You</b>		<b>given</b>	money to charity.
<b>We</b>		<b>taken</b>	3 tests today.
<b>They</b>		<b>written</b>	2 books.

<b>She</b>		<b>finished</b>	her homework.
<b>It</b>		<b>broken</b>	its leg 3 times.
