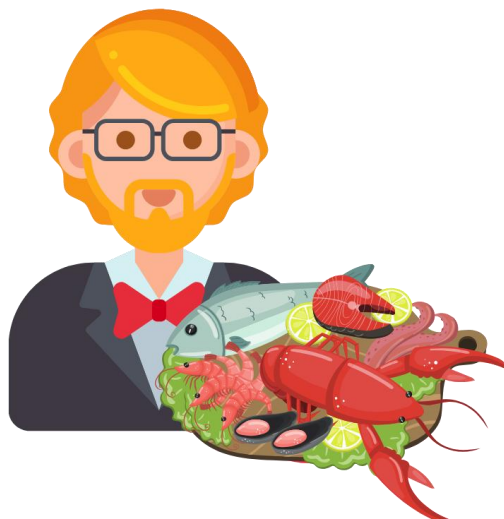


Lesson 3
