

keep (x) around: to keep something near you

- I always keep tissues around just in case I have to sneeze.
- Our new employee is really lazy. I don't think we're going to keep him around much longer.

keep at (it): to continue doing something difficult (similar to 'hang in there' or 'stick with')

• I know you have a lot of stress in school, but if you can just keep at it for six more months, you'll graduate and you'll never have to take another class again.

keep away (from): to stay away; to keep someone near something

• The neighbor yelled at us and told us to keep away from his garden. He even put up a sign in his yard that says "Keep Away!"

keep (x) down: to eat food and not vomit (usually when you're sick or on medication)

• I've been sick for the past two weeks. Today was the first day I was able to eat a big meal and keep it down.

keep from: to stop yourself from doing something

- I was so angry at Derek last night! It took all of my self-control to keep from hitting him!
- I'm trying to keep from eating too much red meat because my doctor said I have high blood pressure.

keep up with: to move as fast as another person; to not fall behind to stay aware of something (news or sports, for example)

- John and I were neck and neck for the entire race, but he pulled ahead at the very end and I couldn't keep up with him.
- I used to be a huge baseball fan, but I don't really keep up with it anymore.
